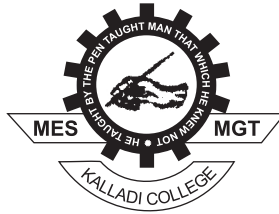
PROFILE OF THE MUSLIM EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY

ABOUT OUR COLLEGE

MES Kalladi College, Mannarkkad is the proud symbol of the Muslim Educational Society, Calicut to the cause of higher education in Kerala, especially to the educationally backward areas of Malabar. This is the first college started by the MES and it is also the felicitous outcome of the noble endeavor of the late Kalladi Cheriya Kunhammed Sahib and the local public. College is located in a vast area, a major part of which was donated by the late Janab Valayadi Kunhayammu Haji.

The college is situated 2 km away from Mannarkkad town on the side of Palakkad - Calicut National Highway and bordered by the perennial river "Kunthipuzha" and fortified by panoramic hills of Silent Valley and Attappadi.

The college started functioning as a junior college in 1967 and was upgraded in 1971 with the introduction of degree courses in History, Economics, Mathematics, Botany and Commerce. Further it was upgraded as a Post Graduate college in 1978 with the introduction of M.Com.

The departments of History and Chemistry have been upgraded as Research Centres in 2016 and 2017 respectively, and are equipped with Modern Laboratories, Research Halls and Research Cubicles. At present the college is offering 17 undergraduate and 8 postgraduate programmes in various disciplines, of which 8 programmes are in the Self Financing Mode.

This Institution has well equipped laboratory facilities in Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics, Mass Communication, Food Technology and Computer Science. The College Library is automated with more than 40,000 bar coded books and journals. Library has a separate digital section with broadband internet connection and INFLIBNET facilities by which students have access to E-journals and E-books. Presently the library is in its process of

modernization with RFID system. The two well equipped computer centres offer short term courses for students along with their regular programmes. College administration is facilitated with Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) software and the implementation of E-learning with ICT integrated classrooms is at its completion. The college is renowned for its achievements in sports and games in the national and international levels. The infrastructure includes a playground with 400 meters track, Indoor Stadium and Gymnasium for physical fitness and training. The college has remarkable achievements in A-Zone and Inter-Zone arts festivals.

The College provides UGC aided minority coaching for the academic improvement of poor and weak students and special coaching is provided for NET, SET, PSC exam, Bank Test etc. All the students benefit from exposure to national seminars and similar academic programmes through active participation.

Different Clubs and Forums: NCC- Navy & Army, Debate Club, Science Club, English Club, ED Club, Women Cell, Career Guidance & Placement Cell, Media Club, Tourism Club, Yoga Club, Cycle Club, Forestry Club, Bhoomitra Club, Agri-Horti Cultural Society, Apiculture Society, Debate Forum etc. offer a wide range of opportunities to students to nurture their talents and they promote their overall development. MES Medical Centre at Attappady (one of the largest tribal settlements in Kerala) with an ambulance is a prestigious Extension Project of the college. Also it runs different Best Practices as a part of its Institutional Social Responsibility.

COLLEGE COUNCIL

The College Council consists of the Principal, all Heads of Departments, College Librarian and two elected representatives of the permanent teaching staff. It is the apex decision making body of the College.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of conduct of the college are formed by the management and the Principal accordance with Government and University rules to ensure a peaceful campus atmosphere.

1. In the light of the judgements of the Honorable High Court of Kerala [2003(2) KLT 582, WP(C) No. 986/2018/(W)] the college has prohibited all political activism within the college campus. Activities such as Demonstration, Campaign, Vandalism, Display of Poster, Banners, Flag, Strike, Gherao, Dharna, Hartal are prohibited.
2. As per the judgement in RP 435/03 by the Honorable High Court of Kerala and the directives of the Registrar of University of Calicut No. L.C. SW (2) College Union Election /OP/04 dated 02-03-05 to this effect, the Management of the College has the right to hold the union election in the Parliamentary form or any other manner it deems right for the maintenance of discipline in the campus.
3. Students of M.E.S. Kalladi college, Mannarkkad shall try their best to uphold the honour and prestige of the institution by huminity, fellow feeling and hard work. They should endeavour to create an atmosphere conducive to academic cultural and social progress.
4. Student must observe strict discipline in the campus, behave with dignity and courtesy to the principal, faculty members, administrative staff, visitors and fellow students.
5. Class hours are from 9.30am to 3:15 pm. Be in time for classes. Day scholars are not expected to be present on the campus after 4.00pm.
6. Once students are admitted to the college, they are bound by the code of conduct laid down by the college through the college calendar.
7. Students should come to the campus wearing the stipulated uniform only. On special occasions students are exempted from uniform only with the permission of Principal. But only formal dressing will be allowed in the campus. Casual dressing / specially designed / gang dress / extra colour/ special dressing will not be permitted.
8. The college has an approved pattern uniform dress which is binding on all students. The cost of the uniform materials will be collected at the time of admission. Students should keep modesty in dressing by keeping

away from using indecent dress. Also they are not allowed to cover their face while they are in the campus.

9. Staff members/Discipline Committee shall have the powers to deny admission to students to classes/office/labs/ library/meetings/cultural programs in the case of violation of the dress code of the college.
10. students shall always wear identity cards issued by the college with tag and show them as and when demanded by the Principal, teachers and office staff/security staff.
11. Political activism is strictly banned in the campus. Students are forbidden to organize or attend meetings other than the official ones. Students resorting to strikes are prohibited from entering the verandah of the building or the class room.
12. No students shall use or keep in possession alcoholic drinks or drugs. Using/keeping of these items will lead to immediate expulsion of the students from the college and hostels.
13. Students are not allowed to organize or attend any meeting in the college or collect money for any purpose without the written permission of the Principal. Outsiders are not allowed to attend or organize any programme inside the campus.
14. The principal shall have the power to inflict the following punishments; fine, cancellation of attendance, withholding of term certificate, forfeiture of educational concession and scholarships, suspension, rustication from one or more semesters, expulsion, compulsory issue of TC etc.
15. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual inattention to class work, obscenity in word or act are sufficient reasons for the permanent or temporary dismissal of a student.
16. Students should keep vigilance on timely notifications and announcements. Failure / ignorance will not be an excuse.
17. Banners, flags, Poster, etc. shall not allowed inside the campus or at the gates or compound walls without the permission of the Principal.
18. Students who are charged in criminal offence and are under suspension shall not be allowed to enter the campus without permission.
19. Student are allowed to bring vehicles into the campus with th prior permission. They have to park their vehicle at the allotted place at their own risk. Stunting and racing of vehicles within and in a radius of 200 meters outside the campus are strictly banned. Students and staff have to register their vehicle number and licence number with the security.
20. Disfiguring of walls damaging of fittings and fixtures, attracts fine or disciplinary actions. Collective fines will be imposed for any damage if the cause cannot be traced to any individual.
21. Students are strictly prohibited to use mobile phone in the College Campus. If students are found using mobile phones in the campus, their phones would be confiscated and serious action taken against them.
22. Daily absentees reports, and other important messages are send as SMS alerts to the parents mobile number.

23. Cinematic dance, DJ, Fashion show and birthday parties shall not be allowed inside the college campus.
24. Ragging is a criminal offence and its any form should be seriously dealt. To register the complaint regarding the ragging by students should be within 24 hours and, the action will be taken within the next 24 hours. Help line : **1800-180-5522. Website : helpsite@antiragging.net**

ANTI RAGGING CELL

Our College maintains a healthy and congenial academic environment for the student. The institution offers protection to the new entrants from the menace of ragging. In this regard this institution has constituted an Anti-ragging cell. Also an anti ragging Squad has been deputed from all department to monitor students discipline both inside and outside the campus. The college level punishment in cases of ragging as per UGC directives includes one or more of the following:

1. Suspensions from attending classes and academic privileges.
2. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
3. Debarring from appearing any test/ examination or other evaluation process. Withholding of results.
4. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
5. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for specific periods.

The UGC has issued very strong and detailed regulations for curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions. As per regulations any of the following acts come under the purview of ragging.

- a. Any conduct by any student or student whether by words (spoken or written) or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student
- b. Indulging in rowdy or in disciplined activities by any student or students which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension there of in any fresher or any other student
- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the psyche of such fresher or any other student
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disturb the regular

academic activity of any other student or a fresher;

- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic task assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- f. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it; sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing for obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing boily harm or any other danger to health or person
- g. Any act or abusive spoken words, e-mails, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student
- h. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidance of a fresher or any other student

1. Tuition fees will be collected either in lump at the beginning of the year or in installments at the beginning of each terms or semester, as the case may be.
2. Special fees should be paid together with the first instalment of tuition fees.
3. After the 7th working day the fees can be paid with a fine of Rs. 5/-, on or before the next 10th day. Even after this date, the the fees will be received with a fine of Rs. 10/- on the date prescribed before the last working day of the month.
4. The names of students who do not remit fees with in the prescribed dates will be published on the notice board. The names of the defaulters will be removed from the roll and for re-admission they have to remit the fees, fine and Rs. 50 (charge of re-admission). The fees for semester course has to be paid at the beginning of each semester and if a student defaults the above rules will be applicable. At the beginning of the academic year the special fees has to be paid in total.
5. Fees will be received at the office counter between 9.30 am. and 1.30 pm.(on all working days).
6. Students should always obtain a receipt from the office for any payment made by them for any future reference.
7. Every students is liable to pay the prescribed fees for the entire term during any part of which his/her name remains on the rolls of the college.
8. When the due date for any payment happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be treated as a due date.
9. Students when admitted as term students for making up shortage of attendance, one third of annual tuition fees with full special fees and the caution deposits would be collected from them at the time of admission.
10. Fees once collected will not be re funded.
11. The guardians of all newly admitted students have to pay Rs. 1750/- towards the membership fee of the Parents and Teachers Association

STUDENT AID FUND

A fund is maintained by collecting donations from the staff and the students of the college and public to help the poor and deserving students by giving them scholarship and other kind of help.

MEDICAL INSPECTION

All the students of the college have to undergo medical inspection once during a course of study. The medical officer will render his service to the college hostel if necessary.

ATTENDANCE & LEAVE

1. No student shall be absent from the class without leave. The reason for leave shall be clearly stated.
2. Application for leave shall be submitted, countersigned by guardian with the recommendation of the group tutor before availing leave. In the case of inmates of the hostel all applications for the leave shall be countersigned by Dy. warden.
3. Student coming to the class late or leaving the class early Shall lose half day's attendance.
4. When the absence is due to illness, the application for leave should be supported by a medical certificate. Medical certificate should be submitted on attending classes immediately after illness. Medical certificates submitted at the end of the year will not be entertained.
5. A student who is without leave for ten consecutive working days stands the risk of having his/her name struck off the rolls.
6. The minimum attendance of the 75% of the total working days of the semester required for the attendance certificate is absolutely necessary for promotion and for admission to the university examination.
7. Students whose attendance falls below the minimum shall apply for exemption to the university through the Principal. The application in the prescribed form shall be accompanied by a Chelan of Rs. 350/-. The reason for each day's absence should be explained. On account of illness, a medical certificate also has to be submitted. In no case will exemption be granted by the university, if the shortage of attendance exceed 9 days in the semester. No exemption will be granted during a course for more than two semesters. The application for condonation should be made in the prescribed form, which can be had from the university. The application for condonation shall be forwarded to the university at least 10 days before the commencement of university examinations. The applications will be forwarded only in the presence of Guardian.
8. If a student is unable to attend classes as he /she represents the college in extra-curricular and co-curricular activities he/she may apply for attendance for such days. Such application shall be duly recommended by the responsible member of staff and countersigned by Principal shall be submitted within 3 days of such activities. The Principal reserves all right to grant or refuse such application at his own discretion. The ceiling limit for such attendences is 10 days / semester

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All members of the staff and students are members of the College library and are entitled to use library for reference and to take books on loan.
2. The library follows an Open access system.
3. While entering the library, users should leave their personal belongings, such as bags, personal books, near the counter reserved for this purpose. However, they can carry plain paper for note taking.
4. Library uses RFID technology for Circulation, entry and exit.
5. Members are required to bring their RFID enabled ID card to enter the Library.
6. Library's online public access catalogue (OPAC) can be accessed with in the library and on internet.
7. Members can access e-resources under N-LIST programme.
8. Library is place to build knowledge through resources available in the library, keeping the same in view, pin drop silence and peace is supposed to be observed in the Library.
9. Number of books allowed to various members: 1. Graduate Students : 1 book 2. Post Graduate Students: 5 books 3. Faculty: 10 books 4. Non-teaching staff: 1 book
10. All the issued books must be returned on or before the due date so as to avoid overdue charges and make them available for use by other members as well.
11. Members shall not keep a book for more than fortnight, a book may be reissued to the same member if there is no applicant for it.

12. Absence from college will not be admitted as an excuse for delay in returning books.
13. The librarian may recall a book at any time even when the normal period of loan is not over.
14. Members are not allowed to sub-lend the books taken by them. Breach of this rule may lead to the loss of the membership.
15. Member shall replace books lost or pay for them a price to be fixed by the principal.
16. The resources available in the Library have been purchased not only to extend services to the present members but also for the future members of the library. Hence, the member, while utilizing these resources, should not tamper the document, write upon, damage, torn down the pages or mark on any library materials.
17. If a book is not returned before due date, a fine of Rs1 /- per book for days including holiday will be levied from the students and staff.
18. On working days the library will be kept open from 8.30am to 5.00pm
19. Blind students can make use of Braille Dictionaries.
20. No current issue of periodicals can be issued to students or staff. Back issues of periodicals may be taken home on loan. No users shall keep a periodical for more than 7 days.
21. Members are supposed to leave the book on nearest table whenever they take the books from the open shelves so as to avoid misplacement of book.
22. All users are requested to keep their mobiles switched off or in silent mode in the library. Use of speaker phone/head phone is not allowed in the library.
23. Sleeping, Smoking, Drinking, Eating, loitering, gossiping inside the library is strictly forbidden.
24. Computer in the library premises should be used for academic purposes only.
25. Students should not disturb the arrangements of the library furniture.

COLLEGE HOSTELS

Hostel facilities are provided for boys and girls with limited number of seats. Students staying outside should obtain prior permission of the principal.

HOSTEL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The mens hostel is owned and managed by the MES. Kalladi College Management. The ladies Hostel is Granted by UGC.
2. Disciplinary action may be taken against those who violate the rules & regulation.
3. If the conduct of a hostler is not satisfactory, the Principal and management has the right to dismiss him/her from the hostel without prior notice
4. If it is found at later stages that the information furnished by the resident in his/her application is incorrect or that he/she is not meeting eligibility criteria for admission his/her admission to the hostel will be cancelled.
5. The management reserves the right to add, amend or remove any part or whole of the aforesaid rules and regulation
6. Admission to hostel is only for one academic year & it may be renewed after each academic year. For this the student concerned has to re-apply. Parent should be present at the time of admission & and readmission
7. The admission & readmission will be done at the discretion of the management / principal.
8. All the fees & charges should be paid at the time of admission.
9. Hostel fee for each month should be remitted before the 5 th of next month & the receipt should be collected and kept for future reference. In case of any dispute it should be produced along with the complaints .
10. There will not be any reduction in monthly fee in the case of absence less than 10 consecutive days.

11. The management has the right to change the rate of the fees from time to time and it will be informed to the residents or there will be a reasonable annual increase in the fee
12. Each resident shall keep her room & parts of the building clean and care. Residents have to be always well dressed in the premises.
13. The resident has to bring her own bedding, linen, bucket, Mug, plate, Tiffin box, toilet articles and other personal articles.
14. Every resident is responsible for his/her own personal belongings.
15. Do not stick pictures, posters, or notices on the walls or scribble on furniture and walls.
16. Sanitary pads/towels should be disposed off hygienically in the container provided for the purpose and not in any other place. If any blockage happens in the toilets due to the careless disposal, the repairing charge will be collected from the residents.
17. Sufficient water is supplied. Water wastage is prohibited. All residents should finish their bathing and washing of cloths before 6 P.M.
18. Food shall be taken only in the dining room. Food will not be available after the time fixed for each time. (Break fast 8.30 AM-9.15 AM, Lunch 12.30 PM-1.15 AM., supper 7.30 PM-8.15 PM). Silence should be observed from 10 PM to 8 AM and during study time.
19. Visiting of other room is strictly forbidden.
20. Switch off the lights at 10 PM to 5 AM in rooms.
21. In case of mobile phones and laptop for use in special circumstances written permission from the warden should be obtained after paying the stipulated fee for it. Mobile phone can be used only at times stipulated time by hostel authorities from time to time. They should not use the Mobile

phone other than the specified time. Using mobiles other than the specified time may lead to the fine of Rs. 500/- and the use of mobile phone inside the living room is strictly prohibited. Violation of this rule may lead to the dismissal. In case of any violation mobile phone will be confiscated and permission for using mobile phone will be cancelled for such person.

22. For participating in any other activities other than the regular class in the college, inmates should get prior permission after submitting a written request to the warden.
23. Inmates are not permitted to go out of the hostel campus before 8AM and they should come back after the class. Nobody will be permitted to stay out of the hostel after 6PM. Violation of this will lead to the automatic removal of the inmates from hostel.
24. Only in urgent cases the students are permitted to go out of the hostel. In such situation they should get prior permission from the warden and should be recorded in the movement register kept by the watchman.
25. Any one found intoxicated will not be allowed to continue to stay in the hostel. Inmates should not possess or consume intoxicating drinks in any form.
26. Electrical & Electronic equipments should not be used by the inmates in their rooms with out prior permission of the warden.
27. No political activities or union activities are allowed inside and the hostel premises.
28. All students going for and returning after holidays should inform the warden well in advance about the time & date of arrival.
29. If a resident goes out for a short while for any purpose, he/she should get written permission from warden and enter in the movement register.
30. Parents & the close relatives can visit the students only between 8AM and 6PM. with the permission of warden. Other visitors are not permitted.

IMPORTANT FACILITIES AND PROGRAMMES

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is functioning in the college in accordance with NAAC guidelines to Monitor the academic and non academic activities of the college

PARENTS AND TEACHERS ASSOCIATION (PTA)

An active PTA has been functioning in the college since 1976. It regularly provides financial aid to economically backward students. It also sponsors some funds to the college for its infra structural development where there is no Govt. aid or it is insufficient. It motivates students who excel in academic field by giving cash awards. It gives proper guidance to the college authorities in maintaining discipline inside the campus.

The parents of each student who is admitted in the college shall join the Association by paying a membership fee. All the teachers will be the members of the association.

Principal is the President of PTA, one of the Teaching Staff Member is the Secretary, and one of the Executive Member from Parents is the Vice President. **The Present Vice President is N. Balamukundan Master.**

PHYSICAL EDUCATION COUNCIL

Provision is made for many major games in the college. The newly constructed 400 meters track, a full fledged foot ball stadium, a gymnasium and facilities for practicing wrestling and judo are also available. A physical education Council is Constituted to advice the principal in all matters relating to physical education. The principal will be the Chairman and the head of the department of physical Education will be the Secretary. The general captain and the captains of various teams will be nominated to the council

COMPUTER LAB

The college offers a well-equipped Computer lab with Broadband connection and full time efficient faculty providing students a conducive environment. DCA & Various Diploma courses are conducted in the Computer Lab under BSS (National development agency promoted by Govt. India)

AUDITORIUM

The College has a well-equipped auditorium with good audio system, is well illuminated and ventilated. This Multipurpose auditorium is a resourceful addition to the infra structural facilities of MES Kalladi College, especially useful for large gatherings of students at functions, cultural meets & conferences.

SEMINAR HALLS

The college has a well-equipped seminar hall with audio visual learning aids like TV, DVD, overhead projector, slide projector and LCD projector. Students are advised to make use of these facilities as supplementary learning device besides the classroom lectures. Films of educational value and films based on prescribed English texts (novel and drama) are exhibited, depending on availability. In addition to this, two well furnished seminar halls are set up with international standards in research centers of History and Chemistry.

MASS COMMUNICATION THEATER

A fully fledged Audio Visual Lab with Dolby sound effects, wide screen and a capacity of 83 seats is functioning under the Department of Mass Communication and journalism. Film screening, sound and video recordings, conferences etc would be held at Audio Visual Lab.

LABORATORIES

The college has science laboratories with equipments worth of lakhs of rupees. The costly and important equipment includes UV - VIS spectrophotometer, Systronics water analyzer, Rotary evaporator, Spectrofluorometer, CRO's, GM.Counters etc.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

College has organized one unit each of senior division N.C.C. Army Wing and Naval Wing.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The NSS units of the collage Have a remarkably good record of team spirit and social commitment. The units Regularly organize a number of student welfare and community welfare extension programmers. Many awareness Programs are organized in the collage under the auspice of the NSS. A lot of the Society useful productive work is being successfully carried out during the annual seven day camp conducted each year at rural localities.

Thre are two NSS Units in this College. The student, who volunteers to participate in a 7- days special camp (work camp) and a mini - camp as well as devotes 280 hours to community service within a period of two years in the course of study, gets a national merit certificate, by the University. NSS volunteers who have certificates are eligible for a grace mark for their University examination.

ASAP

Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP), an initiative by Higher Education and General Education Departments, Govt. of Kerala, aims to bring the students in line with the current labour market, by equipping students with adequate skills and acumen along with their regular academic courses. ASAP provides short term training programmes like 'Summer Skill Training', 'Summer Skill Skool', etc. to train the students with industry relevant skills.

WWS

Walk With a Scholar (WWS) Programme is the another new Initiative Programme of Higher Education Department. It has been observed that the students in Arts, Science and Commerce Colleges do not get necessary orientation, to prepare them for employment or guidance necessary to select areas for higher study. Walk With a

Scholar (WWS) scheme proposes to arrange specialized mentoring programmes for students in the Under Graduate Programmes in Arts, Science and Commerce and to provide guidance for their future.

SSP

The Scholar Support Programme (SSP), part of the 'New Initiatives in Higher Education' initiated by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Kerala aims at imparting additional support to students in curricular areas of weakness. has unpleated the programmes 2014 on wards

INSTITUTIONAL CULTIVATION

With the joined support of Agriculture Department, Mannarkkad. and Department of Botany, MES Kalladi College have newly made a large cultivational area with different varieties of crops, fruits and vegetables etc. Seedlings are cultivated and sold to students, staff and public.

OPEN AUDITORIUM

College has a Modern open Auditorium constructed with the financial support of Parent Teacher Association

CANTEEN

The college has a spacious and clean canteen. The canteen functioning in the college campus, serves quality food items on all working days to the students and staff at moderate rate.

HISTORY MUSEUM

The Department of History of our college houses a heritage Museum and replica of megalithic monuments. It includes a variety of pavilion of ancient Indian and Kerala living cultures. The Museum provides facilities for research scholars and students.

CO-OPERATIVE STORE

The college co- operative store will be open on all working days. Essential items including books and other study materials would be distributed through this store.

GYMNASIUM

There is a well - equipped gymnasium in the campus. students can utilise the facilities available in the gymnasium at a nominal fee. The gymnasium is open before and after class hours.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

With a view to improve general discipline of the college and also to provide opportunities for the staff to have closer contact with students and thus to enable them to look after the welfare of the students better a tutorial system has been introduced. Students are divided into batches and placed under group tutors. Each group tutor will keep regular watch over the progress and conduct of students under his care and will help them in their studies in a general way.

All applications including applications for leave or absence and representation to the principal shall be made only through the group tutor concerned. University Examination application forms shall be attested by the concerned group tutor. The Progress and the conduct of the students will be intimated to the parents by the group tutor.

PROCTORIAL SYSTEM

The object of proctorial system is to maintain discipline and decorum among students.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

COLLEGE UNION

The college union council is constituted as per the rules laid down by the university. The conduct of college union election will be decided according to the policies of MES Central committee and the college council (See the page of code of conduct No. 2)

U.G.C. AIDED MINORITY COACHING CENTRE

U.G.C. Aided Centre for coaching students belonging to educationally backward minority communities is functioning in the college. The centre started in 1985 with U.G.C. assistance, arranges special coaching for candidates preparing for competitive examination conducted by UPSC, NET, CAT, LIC etc.

ENGLISH CLUB & LANGUAGE LAB

The club is intended to inculcate literary taste, develop debating skill and the skill of creative writing among the students.

PLANNING FORUM

Students will be enrolled as members to study different aspects of five year plans by conducting seminars, symposiums and to spread the message of planning among the public and help in implementation of plan projects.

CULTURAL FORUM

The Teaching Staff, Non Teaching staff and students will be enrolled as members of the cultural forum. It helps the improvement of the cultural activities of the students. Under the cultural forum an endowment is instituted to the best students in cultural and sports activities.

STUDENTS COUNSELING CENTRE

The guidance and counselling centre is to help the students to adjust to the abilities, interests and needs of the society and helps them to develop in the desired direction. It helps them to understand themselves by knowing more about their abilities, aptitudes and limitations and get along better with other people and understand the world in which they live.

TOURISM CLUB

A Tourism club is functioning in the college in association with the department of tourism, Government of Kerala.

SILENT VALLEY FORESTRY AND NATURE CLUB

Silent valley forestry and Nature club of the collage is exclusively a student based environment awareness organization. The club mainly aims the population of social Forestry programs by organizing Environment awareness classes, exhibitions etc. The club also actively takes lead in afforestation programs

BHOOMITHRA CLUB

Bhoomithra club is a part of the Bhoomithra sene Scheme under the Environmental education and Awareness programmes of Govt. of Kerala. This is a club functioning under the guidance of Environment and climate change. This club is aims in strengthening the commitments of students towards environment protection.

LITERACY CLUB

The Literacy Club facilitates the development of society with various activities to promote the process of continuous self renewal.

WELCHEM EXTENSION CENTRE

WELCHEM The extension activity cell of Department of

Chemistry offer all possible services and activities for the benefit of the society. The following are the major services given by the center

1. DRC (Dry Rubber Content) determination of field latex
2. Water Analysis and quality checking
3. Low cost production of high quality toilet soaps
4. Awareness classes about the advantages/disadvantages of the usage fertilizers, fungicides, pesticides, soil testing, leaf testing information etc.
5. Quality checking and recommendation of fertilizers to farmers. etc

FUNCTIONAL ARABIC CENTRE

The centre provide facility of translating Arabic documents into English documents and English documents into Arabic documents, translations of Visas, Driving Licence etc.

REMEDIAL COACHING CENTRE

Taking the fact that students coming from school classes to college are very weak in English, the English Department gives special tuition for the students of the near by schools in spoken English and basic English Grammar. Other departments also provide remedial coaching for their weak students

HEALTH CLUB

Health clubs deals with the physical fitness, diseases and the medical history of the students. Yoga is also practiced under health club The club is attached to the Department of Physical Education.

With a view to enlighten the public and the students about the importance of conservation of nature and natural resources, a forum of students and teachers is formed with the name Agri-Horticultural Society.

ARCHEOLOGICAL MUSEUM

An archaeological museum was started in 1986. UGC provides financial assistance to expand the museum. The museum curator and PG students of the Department of History conduct extensive exploration in the surrounding areas.

WOMEN'S FORUM

The Vanitha Vedi was formed with the aim of protecting the welfare of the girl students and enabling them to solve their personal problems and other grievances.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

In order to continue the contact with the outgoing students of the institution and to give opportunity to them to take part in the constructive activities for the progress and prosperity of the institution, each department of the college has an alumni association under it.

CO-OPERATIVE CONSUMERS STORE
