


1. Was the syllabus updated enough?




4. Have you learnt any new skills in the due course of your study?

5. Did the syllabus create interest to pursue research in a particular topic?




6. Did the subject/courses help in developing your personality?


7. Will you recommend your relatives/friends to enroll in the college?


8. The teacher-student relation in the college was good at the college. Do you agree?


9. Does the college involve Alumni in their activities?
