




2) Did the course curriculum intellectually stimulate you?


4) Have you learnt any new skills in the due course of your study?


5) Did the syllabus create interest to pursue research in a particular topic?

6) Did the subject/courses help in developing your personality?




The majority of alumni (88.7%) believe that their courses positively contribute to their personality development, indicating that the curriculum has a significant positive impact on


7) Will you recommend your relatives/friends to enroll in the college?


8) The teacher-student relation in the college was good at the college. Do you agree?




