IV. Headline the following stories. Each question carries 1 weightage.

- 25 **New Delhi** : The UPA — II, celebrating three years in office, gave the “common man” a gift on Wednesday : the steepest ever increase of Rs. 7.54 in petrol prices. The increase is the first in the past six months.
- 26 **Mumbai** : While the rupee hit an all-time low of 56.22 against the dollar, equities closed low as the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) 30-share sensitive index (Sensex) closed below the psychological level of 16000 on Wednesday. The rupee slumped to 56.2250 intraday, falling for the sixth consecutive trading day, closing at 55.9950/56.0050.
- 27 **Cairo** : Egyptian voters headed for polling booths in droves on Wednesday to take part in the two-day presidential polls that are likely to define the course of the revolution that began last year, bringing down Hosni Mubarak.
- 28 **Thiruvananthapuram** : The Kerala State Electricity Board (KSEB) on Wednesday withdrew the 30 minute cyclical load-shedding that was in force during the evening hours in the State since April 4. The earlier decision was to continue the load-shedding till May 31.
